#### **Where do I check in?**

Stop by the check-in table to grab a name badge and handouts.

We'll start checking in at 8:30 AM in the [Visitor's Center Auditorium](#), which is right inside the capitol building entrance.

If you arrive later in the day, no problem, there will be a self check-in table set up inside the first floor rotunda where you can grab your name badge and handouts.
